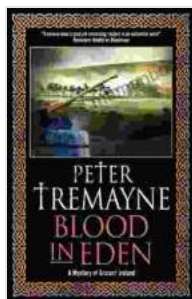


# Blood in Eden: A Sister Fidelma Mystery

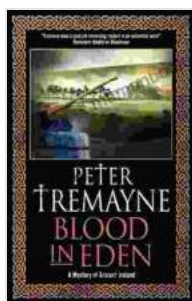

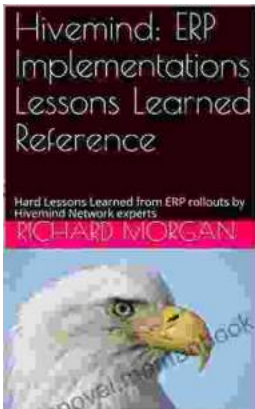
